Report from the LGBT Discernment Team

In February of 2014, the Diaconate issued a charge to the LGBT Discernment Team to organize and provide opportunities for our congregation to prayerfully and intentionally consider our church's relationship with members of the LGBT community. The Team was further charged to report to the Diaconate its sense of the church's consensus as it relates to this topic.

On Monday, May 4, 2015, our Team presented such a report to the Diaconate. The Diaconate discussed the report and by an overwhelming majority accepted the report and joined our team in affirming the report's description of the consensus of the congregation.

The full report of the LGBT Discernment Team is as follows:

After observing and participating in the church's process of intentional spiritual discernment, the members of the Discernment Team recognize that:

- First Baptist Greenville is a diverse congregation, unified by our shared identity as a people of faith and by our mutual commitment to be the people God is calling us to be.
- We are a covenant people, bound together, not by agreement on all issues, but by our desire to worship and serve together, and by our commitment to embody and embrace the spirit of Christ. We welcome, honor, and respect the views of all members.
 - Being open and welcoming to all people is part of the essential nature of our community of faith.
 - Our current Mission Statement¹ is a clear expression of the will of our congregation.

Therefore, the Discernment Team unanimously affirms the following:

"In all facets of the life and ministry of our church, including but not limited to membership, baptism, ordination, marriage, teaching and committee/organizational leadership, First Baptist Greenville will not discriminate based on sexual orientation or gender identity."
