Missions Updates

Most likely you have heard of our church's Foundation and may be aware of some of the ministries that benefit from the Foundation distribution each year – from scholarships to music to missions to property needs and more. Various committees use Foundation funds to support and extend their ministry. One committee that benefits from Foundation funding is the Missions and Affiliations Committee.

The Missions and Affiliations Committee receives funding requests from potential mission partners by October 1, each year, makes funding decisions by December 1, and distributes funds by December 31, to be used for ministry in the following calendar year. As they review and make decisions on the requests, the committee seeks to balance funds between local missions and missions beyond our local community. To the right is a list of mission partners receiving funding for 2018. Funds given totaled \$75,000.

Give a Little

Growing up, I don't ever remember my mother talking with my sisters and me about giving to church, but I grew up Baptist, so I remember pledge cards, building campaigns and sermons about giving on Commitment Sunday. I remember when I had a part time job in high school, and I filled out my first pledge card. I think I pledged \$100. I felt very official a few weeks later when I picked up my box of offering envelopes with my name printed on one for each week of the coming year. Most of the envelopes never got used, and I think I fulfilled my pledge with the very last one.

I remember a couple of years ago when I received a call asking if I would serve on the Stewardship Committee. I had never been on a church committee before, and I was unsure about accepting. The caller assured me that "it's much easier now that we aren't doing pledge campaigns and you don't have to make all those calls." It's true. It is easier for the Stewardship Committee when there is no pledge campaign and you don't have to call your fellow members asking for them to commit to giving to the church. I don't know that a lot of people miss pledge campaigns. It is easier this way, but it is also easier for giving to be overlooked when we don't have that reminder. It's easy to let the offering plate pass by if you open your wallet and don't happen to have any cash or if you forgot your checkbook. It's easy to think about all the other

expenses you have and decide that there are plenty of other members who are probably giving money; the church will be fine if you don't give this month. Not giving can be very easy.

Giving can be easy too. After always hoping that I would have cash on Sundays, trying to remember where we left the checkbook, or trying to "catch up" at the end of the year or when there's "extra" money, I finally chose the easy way. I went to the church website and set up a recurring gift each week. It took less time than it would have taken to find a checkbook, an envelope and a stamp. Now, every Monday I get an email thanking me for the contribution. Each time I see that email, I feel a little sense of relief that someone or something or some software program remembered to give for me.

I will rotate off the Stewardship Committee at the end of the year, but I hope that I have helped, even just a little, to keep making the job easy for everyone that continues to serve. We need everyone's help. If you aren't giving, please give. If you give occasionally, give consistently. If you give consistently, try to give a little more than before. If we can all do this, we can continue to grow our giving, and we can do it without a single pledge card.
