Lent is a forty-day season in the liturgical calendar when Christians reflect on their relationship with God and others in preparation for Easter. It is a season of meditation, confession, self-examination and service. Read on to discover how you can engage the Lenten season through worship services and prayer opportunities.

- Pick up a Lenten Devotional created by FBG church members. This year's devotional features poetry on the theme of resurrection. Devotionals will be available at our Ash Wednesday service on February 22 and at the front desk. - Pray on the church campus. The Sanctuary is open for individual prayer during office hours, and the outdoor Labyrinth is accessible anytime. The Chapel is also open for private prayer during office hours, including a self-guided tour of the Stations of the Cross. If you prefer to pray with others, the Centering Prayer group meets on Tuesdays and would love to welcome you!
- Attend a MidWeek Fellowship on Wednesdays in Lent. Beginning March 1, Kyle Matthews will lead a series titled, "Unstuck," providing Lenten suggestions

on how to get unstuck with spiritual practices like reading Scripture, prayer, service to others and holistic self-care. MidWeek Fellowship meets from 6:15-7:00pm in the Fellowship Hall.

## Engaging Black History Month with FBG Sister Church Springfield Baptist

February is Black History Month, a national invitation to recognize the history of Black people in America and celebrate the joy of Black communities. This year, we invite you to engage with Springfield Baptist Church, our sister church in Greenville, by investing in the past, present and future of this historic church.

Springfield Baptist was organized in 1867 by sixty-five Black members of First Baptist Greenville (then called Greenville Baptist Church) and is the oldest historically Black Baptist church in downtown Greenville. recap of a presentation featuring Dr. Kimberly Kellison, historian at Baylor University, and me.

We honor the present chapter of Springfield Baptist by celebrating the calling of their new pastor, Rev. Vinson Royal! Rev. Royal is a graduate of Beulah Heights Bible University and the Morehouse School of Religion. He is a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., has served on the Board of Directors for Concerned Black Clergy (CBC) of Atlanta and is the former Vice President of the Baptist Ministers Council of Georgia. Springfield will host a public panel on Saturday, February 18, as part of the Remembrance Project, a group offering education and memorialization around victims of lynching in Greenville. Matt Rollins will serve as a panelist alongside Springfield's Rev. Royal.

Looking for other ways to engage in Black history outside Black History Month? Read a history of Black Civil War veterans, titled The Families' Civil War: Black Soldiers and the Fight for Racial Justice, by church member Holly Pinheiro Jr. Keep your eve out for the next FBG racial justice pilgrimage.
