In 2013, when my mom was diagnosed with cancer, I leaned heavily on the support of my church community. Their care steadied me. They checked in regularly, asked how she was doing, and reminded me they were praying. When I wrestled with guilt over spending time away from church responsibilities to be with my mom, they reassured me I was exactly where I needed to be. Their love made a painful season more bearable.

This kind of care is sacred. But sadly, not all faith communities offer it. During that time, my sister heard many hurtful remarks from Christian friends about our mom's illness. Some asked, "What are you learning?" or "What is God

teaching you through this?"—as if cancer were a lesson plan from God. Another told her that if we just had more faith, our mom would be healed. One Sunday morning, when my sister stayed home to sit beside our mom instead of going to church, a friend said, "The devil is really working on you on Sundays." As if being in a sanctuary is holier than holding the hand of someone who is dying.

There's a better way. And I see that better way in you, too. Here's what people in pain most often need:

- · A quiet "I'm here for you."
- · A steady "I'm praying for you."
- · A humble "I don't know what to say, but I care."
- · A meal. A note. A hug. Silence with presence.

You do these things. Keep doing them.




Special Friday Lunch & More on May 30
