An Antidote to the Restless Competition for Recognition

All virtues – patience, generosity, kindness, etc. – grow in the soil of humility.

To cultivate the soil of humility:

- 1. Speak less and listen more.
- 2. Choose the back of the line on purpose.
- 3. Refrain from constantly managing your image.
 - 4. Do something kind. Do it anonymously.
- 5. Own your shortcomings apologize regularly.
- 6. Resist the urge to name-drop or subtly show off.
 - 7. Be open to criticism.

 Consider: Does it contain a kernel of truth?
 - 8. Give thanks for the source of your gifts. (God, parents, mentors, luck, etc.)

The Daily Examen

A Daily Check-In with God

1. Ask for God's Spirit to guide.

God, help me see my day the way you see it – not just from my own limited perspective.

2. Say thank you.

This day was a gift. Thank you, God, for the big and small blessings of the day.

3. Replay your day.

Take a slow walk back through what happened today.
When did I give and receive Christ's love?
When did I give and receive the least love?
What was the most life-giving part of my day?
What was the most life-thwarting?
When did I have the deepest connection
with God, others and myself?
When did I have the least sense of connection?
When did I live out of the fruit of the Spirit?
Where was there absence of the fruit of the Spirit?

4. As you celebrate your successes, own your mistakes.

Be honest about where you fell short – things you did or said or things you failed to do or say. Bring these to God with openness, trusting in Divine mercy and forgiveness.

Look ahead.

Think about tomorrow.

Where will you need God's help, strength or guidance?

Invite God to be with you in the day to come.
